### Why choose this course?

Begin your career in the health industry with this qualification. You will learn about the musculoskeletal system and treatment options to improve clients' health and wellbeing. This course covers several different types of massage techniques such as deep tissue, trigger point, manual lymph drainage, myofascial, Proprioceptive Neuromuscular Facilitation (PNF advanced massage technique used to help reset muscle holding patterns) and a range of specialised treatments for people with chronic health conditions.

During this course you will acquire a vast knowledge of anatomy, physiology and pathology as well as effective communication skills to deal with clients, health professionals and the health system. This will ensure a sound understanding of working safely and ethically in the healthcare environment. With a very practical and hands on skills training approach, you will have weekly access to a Live Works Clinic at each campus which has been developed to simulate the workplace. Opportunities may arise where you can be part of external sporting events to provide support and in some cases have access to offsite facilities and resources which will be beneficial to your studies.

On completion of this course you will have the skills to assess each client's needs and plan and conduct remedial massage using a wide range of techniques.

Training is conducted by industry specialists in the latest dermal cosmeceutical skin care including how to perform microdermabrasion and specialised skin peels. You will have the opportunity to investigate new developments and learn safety protocols for intense pulsed light and laser hair reduction treatments. On completion of this course you will have the skills to start up your own business and to work in the beauty industry.

During your studies you will learn the skills to operate a cash register and computer, and perform reception duties such as answering telephone calls, making appointments and writing up client record cards.

#### Fee information

There are three types of fees required.

- » **Tuition** – International student tuition fees are set on a commercial basis and are paid as a whole of course fee.
- » **Resource** – These are mandatory fees paid to your TAFE college each semester. These fees are a fixed payment determined by each unit of enrolment. Resources fees are charged for items you will use during your course, for example if you are studying a hospitality course it will be the food that you use; or an art and design course may include paint.
- » **Materials** – These fees are for materials you will keep for use during and after your studies, for example personal protective equipment, text books, uniforms etc.
